1. Battered reeds are people who have been hurt.

Matthew12:21 - In his name the nations will put their hope. (NIV)

Matthew 8:17 - This was to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet Isaiah: "He took up our infirmities and carried our diseases." (NIV)

Matthew 11:28 - "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. (NIV)

Lk. 13:10-13

10. On a Sabbath Jesus was teaching in one of the synagogues,

11. and a woman was there who had been crippled by a spirit for eighteen years. She was bent over and could not straighten up at all.

Isaiah 64:6 . . . all our righteous acts are like filthy rags. (NIV)

Firstly, Those who have never come to Christ to be forgiven.

Secondly, The smoldering wick is the Christian who has backslidden;

Matthew 12:20a - "A battered reed He will not break, And a smoldering wick He will not extinguish..."

Matthew 12:20b - UNTIL HE LEADS JUSTICE (RIGHTEOUSNESS) TO VICTORY.
